What type of research does the behavioral team review?

- ⌘ ***Social-Behavioral*** - research designed to increase the scientific base of information about human behavior of individuals, groups, organizations, or societies.
- ⌘ ***Educational*** - research designed to increase the scientific base of information about education and educational practices.

Examples of social-behavioral-educational research submitted by Danforth Campus investigators (including undergraduate students)...

- ⌘ Studies designed to study the actions and reactions of humans
- ⌘ Common research methods & procedures: behavioral observation, experiment/correlational design, interviews & focus groups, program evaluations, surveys & questionnaires
- ⌘ Other SBE methods & procedures: human factors evaluations (e.g., human performance, technology design/ergonomics, human-computer interactions)
- ⌘ Danforth Schools/departments/programs that conduct human research: *Virtually all of them!*
 - **Arts & Sciences (most common): American Culture Studies, Anthropology, Economics, Education, International & Area Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Women & Gender Studies**
 - **Olin Business School**
 - **School of Engineering & Applied Science**
 - **School of Law**
